In *Peek-a-boo!* you play hide-and-seek with Mousy: each page has a Mousy that you can hide or show. The aim of the book is to practise simple questions to find everyday objects.



How does it work?

Peek-a-boo! contains a sliding Mousy on each page. You can hide it behind everyday objects (such as the basket, the handkerchief or the box) and reveal it by sliding the tab, either vertically or horizontally. As we will see below, it is important to use the tab mechanism together with the text on each page.

Story Mode

With the Talking Pen: upon placing the Talking Pen on the “Start” button on the cover you will hear an activation sound, You can also hear the name of the book in the bottom part of the page.

By placing the Talking Pen on the sentences at the bottom of the page, you will be able to listen to the story.

On each page you should read the phrase and reveal Mousy when you say, “*Peek-a-boo!*”. It is also important to point out the different objects (“scarf”, “box”, “wardrobe”...) when they are mentioned.

In addition, the back cover includes a glossary of the different objects presented in the book. With the Talking Pen, you can listen to the phrases written under each item.

Without the Talking Pen: the title and the story can be read on every page, using the tabs following the same steps mentioned above. It is important to emphasise the questions “***Oh, but where’s Mousy? Mousy, where are you?***”, as well as vocabulary about everyday objects. You can use the glossary on the back cover as a reference for vocabulary.

If you want to make more use of the glossary, you can also ask your baby “What’s this?” while pointing to an object on the page. For example, you can point to the bed and ask

*“What’s this?”, then answer with the following structure “**This is...**”: “This is a bed! Very good!”*

If we want the baby to locate items more independently, you can use the **“Where’s the...?”** structure. For example, you can ask the baby where the sandpit is: *“Where’s the sandpit?”* And once they have found it, say: *“This is a sandpit! Very good!”*

Related songs

The story can be complemented with the **Peek-a-boo with Mousy** song (track#5), available on My Locker. The song can be played or sung on all pages, just before sliding the tab to show Mousy.
